The 2005 Calgary WALK attracted 2,800 Calgarians and their families to register and WALK for multiple sclerosis. Whether being an individual WALKer, a WALKer as part of a team or by pledging a WALKer, getting involved with the Enerflex Super Cities WALK for MS is a magical, heartwarming and unforgettable experience. The funds raised through the Enerflex Super Cities WALK for MS supports the most promising and cutting edge MS research in Canada as well as comprehensive programs and services for those affected by MS.
